Regulatory Compliance System (RCS)

AHPRA is responsible for establishing and maintaining effective and efficient national processes and procedures to deliver the National Registration and Accreditation Scheme. Governed by a national law, AHPRA has core regulatory and support functions that aim to protect the public and facilitate access to health services. AHPRA supports the 14 National Boards for the health professions regulated in the National Scheme. The National Boards set standards and policies that all registered health practitioners must meet.

The RCS project aims to deliver an integrated technology solution to support the notification, monitoring and compliance, audit and offence business processes within AHPRA.

AHPRA is releasing a Request for Information (RFI) to gather information to identify the most effective, practical, scalable, robust and cost efficient software solution that meets the RCS business and technical requirements. AHPRA will evaluate the RFI responses and short-listed respondents will be invited to respond to a Request for Procurement (RFP) that AHPRA may subsequently issue.
