### **AHPRA Consultation: International Criminal History Checks**

#### Introduction

The Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) is undertaking a public consultation on the assessment of applications for the 14 health professions regulated and the use of International Criminal History Checks. Feedback to AHPRA is due 17 August 2012.

HCA is providing feedback from the Nursing Agency Australia (NAA) and Nurse Jobs Australia (NJA) businesses.

#### **Issues**

### 1. Extent of the issue – CrimTrac Screens 2010-2011 (Source AHPRA)

AHPRA will use the following assumptions for future decision making:

- 6% of international applications will return a positive criminal history; and
- of the international applications who have a positive criminal history, 15% will have the potential to affect their registration.

### **HCA Feedback**

HCA views the risk to the Australia public as very low when considering the number of: (1) Potential to affect registration (N 449); and (2) Action on application/registration (N 40).

But, from the public's view, every health practitioner who has a criminal history creates potential risk.

		South Africa, USA, Canada, India and Philippines can apply and obtain their ICHC timely and without too many administrative barriers.  The onus remains with the candidate to provide evidence.
3. AHPRA obtains clearance/information from jurisdiction outside Australia when processing application	2	This would extend the length of time required to process the candidate's registration, only making the process time longer.  This would increase the frustration of applicants and delay recruitment processes.
4. Application makes declaration and AHPRA undertakes random sample audit	3	Random audits do not guarantee that the candidate, who has a CHC would be exposed and would only question the integrity of these audits.  Random audits do not protect the public, in this high risk industry.
