AHPRA update

- the <u>successful prosecution</u> of a health practitioner for advertising offences.
- the Senate inquiry, <u>Complaints mechanism administered under the Health Practitioner Regulation</u> National Law.
- the independent review of chaperoning conditions, and
- a workshop held with key Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health leaders, AHPRA personnel and key stakeholders focused on identifying the National Scheme's strategy and role in ensuring patient safety for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in Australia's health system.
