The Boards are inviting feedback on the following guestions and the Podiatry Accreditation Committee (the Committee) provides their responses below.

1. How helpful and clear is the content and structure of the proposed framework? Please explain your answer.

The Committee found the content and structure of the proposed framework clear and helpful.

The Committee notes the Podiatry Board of Australia's endorsement of scheduled medicines (Pathway B) sits outside the scope of the proposed framework. The Committee further notes the Podiatry Board of Australia has set the parameters for supervised practice under path B in the ESM Registration Standards (2018), so the Committee suggests the proposed framework would apply to other situations such as 'return to practice' or 'overseas applicant'.

2. Is the meaning of 'consult' clear for the purposes of the supervised practice levels? Why or why not?

The Committee did not find any concerns with the meaning of 'consult' for the purposes of the supervised practice levels.

The Committee supports a unified approach between professions to assist a patient's understanding and transparency of their treatment, and to help ensure consistency and rigour in the process.

3. Is there any content that needs to be changed, added or removed in the proposed framework and/or supporting documents? If so, please provide details.

The Committee:

- notes that detail around scope of supervision and consultation would be defined on a case-bycase basis, and
- suggests an explicit reference (and commitment) to "Cultural Safety" alongside "Patient Safety" in Section 4 (Principles).
