Mandatory notifications in a 5+1 internship

The <u>Health Practitioner Regulation National Law</u> (the National Law) establishes requirements for mandatory reporting. Under the National Law, certain groups must make mandatory notifications about practitioners when their health, conduct or performance poses a risk to the public.

Supervisors may be required to make a notification about their 5+1 internship supervisee, if they have concerns about their health or professional conduct.

Similarly, provisional psychologists undertaking a 5+1 internship may be required to make a notification if they have concerns about a supervisor's conduct or performance.

When should a mandatory notification be made

A mandatory notification should be made if there is a reasonable belief that a registered health practitioner is practicing or engaging:

- · with an impairment and placing the public at risk of substantial harm
- · while intoxicated by alcohol or drugs
- in a way that significantly departs from the Code of conduct for psychologists
- in sexual misconduct in connection with their practice.

Supervisors and provisional psychologists can consult with peers, their employer, professional associations, and/or legal practitioners to assist in determining whether to make a notification.

You should make a mandatory notification only if you believe there is risk of substantial harm. Refer to Ahpra's <u>Guidelines for mandatory notifications</u> including assessment flowcharts.

What is the difference between a mandatory and voluntary notification?

When the threshold for a mandatory notification is not met, a voluntary notification can be made. Grounds for a voluntary notification include:

- failure to comply with the requirements of the Guidelines for the 5+1 internship program
- failure to comply with the requirements of the Guidelines for supervisors.

If the subject of the mandatory or voluntary notification is the supervisor, the Psychology Board (the Board) may review their Board-approved supervisor status.
