Community Reference Group Communiqué

The Community Reference Group (CRG) met at the AHPRA National office in Melbourne on Thursday 5 May 2016. New members attended an induction session before the meeting and were formally welcomed by Martin Fletcher (CEO, AHPRA) and Mark Bodycoat (Chair, CRG).

Performance reporting

• The CRG gave advice on the quarterly performance reports for each state and territory.

Notification terminology

- Members offered advice on the most useful terms for consumers.
 - they had a preference for using 'notification' less, unless it had to be used
 - 'concern' and 'complaint' were both valid depending on context, and
 - these terms were consistent with what was used in health services, in the professions and in the community.

Advertising

- CRG members were updated on the current status of complaints regarding chiropractic advertising.
 - Members provided feedback that there was a lack of understanding about evidence-based practice amongst consumers that makes them susceptible to harm.

Awareness raising campaign

- Members were updated on the national awareness campaign aimed at employers, practitioners and the public.
- Members provided feedback on the approach of the public facing aspect of the <u>Safe in the</u> <u>Knowledge</u>' AHPRA campaign.

• The next meeting of the CRG will be held at the AHPRA National office in August 2016.
