3.	Is there important content in these capabilities that is better placed in clinical practice guidelines or in ethical and professional guidelines, and vice versa?	Domain 1 Part 1 We believe that additional guidance around the both the 'legal and ethical boundaries of paramedicine' and 'principles underpinning bio-ethics in paramedicine practice' would be beneficial to the intended audience to provide clarity relating to the competencies. We feel an 'ethical framework' specific to the paramedicine profession would be beneficial for future workforce		
		education, implementation and practical application.		
4.	Is the content on cultural safety clear and helpful? Why or why not?	We believe It is an important inclusion in a paramedic capability document. More detail is required to reasonably inform practise. We feel The addition of the material as a footnote diminishes the importance of the content and subject matter.		
5.	Is the language clear and appropriate? Are there any potential unintended consequences of the current wording?	The domain language is inconsistent and would read better for example 'professional and ethical paramedic practice, communication and collaboration in paramedic practice, professional paramedic practice'. We do not foresee any potential unintended consequences of the current wording.		
6.	Are there jurisdiction-specific impacts for practitioners, or governments or other stakeholders that the Board should be aware of if these professional capabilities are adopted?	None that we have identified for Victoria		
7.	Are there implementation issues the Board should be aware of?	As mentioned, the addition of a 'purpose' statement would assist jurisdictions and the broader audience to identify how they may use the capabilities. The 'how to use the capability statements' does not provide any guidance to their use or implementation.
