CEO report

Business items

Members:

- noted the Ahpra Board 2025 work program
- noted a Business Capability Review will be used as a strategic tool to assess Ahpra's core capabilities (governance, leadership, strategy, operations, service delivery, stakeholder engagement) and inform readiness to deliver the next NRAS Scheme Strategy.
- noted the information provided on recency of practice and Codes of conduct to progress to the National Scheme Partnerships Committee November meeting
- approved the People and Remuneration Committee annual report 2024/25
- noted the results of the 2025 People and Remuneration Committee effectiveness survey.

Discussion items

Members were provided with a comprehensive overview of the Salesforce project and the program roadmap to finalise delivery. Members were also given the opportunity to provide their input into Ahpra's approach to implementation of the Dawson review.
