Policy: Managing communication with children and young people

Content warning: The content and the emotional impact of the information covered in this document may be confronting and disturbing as it references child abuse.

Overview

Ahpra may, from time to time, receive notifications from a child or young person¹ or need to communicate with a child or young person as part of the management of a notification.

As part of our obligations under the National Child Safe Standards and to ensure Ahpra is a child safe organisation this document has been developed to provide guidance on who should manage communications with children or young people.

Policy

Ahpra is committed to ensuring systems and processes are child safe and encourage participation by children and young people.

All notifications/complaints from children and young people are taken seriously by Ahpra and the National Boards.

All staff dealing with notifications that raise allegations of sexual abuse receive additional training including training in relation to dealing with vulnerable people.

All staff who are likely to deal directly² with children or young people through their work in notifications will receive additional training in relation to communicating with/interviewing children.

All staff dealing with notifications that raise allegations of sexual abuse and other notifications where children are victims, receive additional and ongoing support due to the increased risk and exposure to vicarious trauma.

All staff likely to deal directly with children or young people through their work in notifications will be required to have a current working with children check.

All children or young people directly involved in the notification process will be referred to the Notifier Support Service or alternate external social work support service.

All children (and victims of historical childhood sexual abuse) will be provided information in relation to relevant referral services in their state or territory.

All children or young people directly involved in the notification process will be able to be assisted by a parent/guardian or appropriate support person.

All children or young people directly involved in the notification process will be provided translation or interpretation services as required.

¹ For the purpose of this policy a child or young person is defined as someone under the age of 18 years.

² Where information needs to be obtained directly from the child or young person.

Action Items:

Identified members of Notifications team to receive additional training in relation to communicating/interviewing children.

Identified Notifications team members and Operations Managers to obtain working with children clearance. At least one person in each Australian state and territory to have current clearance. See process in each jurisdiction at Attachment A.

ATTACHMENT A

Process: Applying for a Working with Children Check

Working with children checks are state or territory based. If this process applies to you, you will need to apply in the state or territory where you are located.

You will need to complete an online application (except in WA). Fees are associated with applying for a Working with Children Check (WWCC) and will be reimbursed by Ahpra.

To complete your application, you will need:

- information about your full legal name and any names you may have, including previous names, maiden name, names you have legally changed, aliases and informal names (like nicknames);
- your current address and 5 -10 years of address history;
- if you are verifying your identity online (100-point check), you will need an Australian driver's licence or permit, plus one of these:
 - Australian birth certificate or extract
 - o Australian citizenship certificate
 - Australian passport.
