The Royal Australian College of General Practitioners (RACGP) thanks the Medical Board of Australia for the opportunity to provide comment on the consultation on the recognition of genetic pathology as a new field of specialty practice.

The RACGP does not have any concerns with the proposed changes, with the caveat that the decision does not negatively impact patient access (including out of pocket cost, distribution of services and waiting times).

Additionally, the RACGP suggests that 'just-in-time', accessible resources are developed to assist GPs and their patients in this rapidly evolving area of practice.
