#### Pandemic response sub-register

Ahpra and the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Practice Board of Australia established a short-term pandemic response sub-register for up to 12 months (or less if the pandemic subsides) to help with fast tracking the return to the workforce of experienced and qualified health practitioners. 


