STATUTORY DECLARATION

A person who intentionally makes a false statement in a statutory declaration is guilty of an offence, the punishment for which is imprisonment for a term of 4 years under s27 of the *Oaths Act 1936 (SA)*

6. I understand the provision of false and/or misleading information may constitute behaviour or conduct for which action may be taken against me and which may result in the suspension or cancellation of my registration in the event I have been granted registration.
7. I am further aware that a person who knowingly makes a false statement in a statutory declaration is guilty of an offence under s27 of the *Oaths Act 1936 (SA)*.

Without limitation, s 28 to the *Oaths Act 1936* (SA) provides that statutory declarations may be made before—

- (a) all Judges and Masters of the Supreme Court; and
- (b) all District Court Judges; and
- (c) all special magistrates; and
- (ca) all Registrars and Deputy Registrars of the Supreme Court, the District Court, the Environment, Resources and Development Court, the Industrial Relations Court, the Youth Court and the Magistrates Court; and
- (d) all persons on the roll of practitioners of the Supreme Court (except any such person whose right to practise the profession of law is under suspension by virtue of disciplinary action taken against him); and
- (e) any other persons appointed by the Governor to be Commissioners for taking affidavits in the Supreme Court.
