Without limitation, in accordance with s12 of the of the *Oaths Act 2001* (Tas) statutory declarations may be made before—

- (1) a person who is currently licensed or registered under a law to practise in one of the following occupations:

Patent attorney	Pharmacist	Physiotherapist
Psychologist	Trade marks attorney	Veterinary surgeon
- (2) a person who is enrolled on the roll of the Supreme Court of a State or Territory, or the High Court of Australia, as a legal practitioner (however described); or
- (3) a person who is in the following list:
 - Agent of the Australian Postal Corporation who is in charge of an office supplying postal services to the public
 - Australian Consular Officer or Australian Diplomatic Officer (within the meaning of the *Consular Fees Act 1955*)
 - Chief executive officer of a Commonwealth court
 - Commissioner for Affidavits; Commissioner for Declarations
 - Judge of a court, Justice of the Peace, Magistrate or Bailiff
 - Notary public, Police officer, Sheriff, Registrar, or Deputy Registrar, of a court.
