March 2020 meeting of the Osteopathy Board of Australia

The 121st meeting of the Osteopathy Board of Australia (the Board) was held on 27 March 2020 by teleconference. The Registration and Notification Committee (RNC) also met on the same day as the Board meeting.

The Board publishes this communiqué on our website and emails it to a broad range of stakeholders. At each meeting the Board considers a wide range of issues, many of which are routine and are not included in this communiqué.

COVID-19 messages to osteopaths

Due to the challenges brought about by the national emergency associated with COVID-19 the Board has already started to make a series of pragmatic decisions, temporarily modifying some of our regulatory requirements while maintaining patient safety. The Board has published statements addressing a range of issues, including continuing professional development, Senior First Aid Certificate, infection control and recency of practice on the website. The Board will continue to update osteopaths via emails and news on the Board's website.

Accredited programs of study

One of the objectives of the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law, as in force in each state and territory (the National Law) is to facilitate the provision of high-quality education and training of health practitioners.

The National Law sets out the role of the Board and its appointed accreditation authority, the Australian Osteopathic Accreditation Council (AOAC), in relation to the accreditation and approval of education providers and programs of study for the osteopathy profession. Programs of study approved by the Board are published on the Ahpra website.

Approval of extended accreditation of program of study at Southern Cross University

Under section 49(1) of the National Law, the Board decided to continue to approve until 31 December 2022 the Bachelor of Clinical Sciences (Osteopathic Studies) / Master of Osteopathic Medicine at Southern Cross University as providing a qualification for the purpose of registration in the osteopathy profession, which is the existing program of study.
