#### Pandemic response sub-register

Ahpra and the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Practice Board of Australia established a short-term pandemic response sub-register for up to 12 months (or less if the pandemic subsides) to help with fast tracking the return to the workforce of experienced and qualified health practitioners. The pandemic response sub-register came into effect on 6-April June 2020. Eligible practitioners were added to the pandemic response sub-register. 

Table 1.2 Percentage by principal place of practice




