

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> Endorsement subtypes under area of practice endorsement: Out of 33% psychologists holding area of practice endorsement, most of them have one endorsement subtype – clinical psychology (69%), counselling psychology (5.5%), clinical neuropsychology (4.6%), educational and developmental psychology (4.3%), organisational psychology (3.9%), forensic psychology (2.8%), health psychology (1.4%), sport and exercise psychology (0.6%) and community psychology (0.2%). The remaining 7.5% have two or more endorsement subtypes.

#### Changes to registration categories<sup>6</sup>

- General registration increased from 81.5% to 82.6% of registrants
- Provisional registration increased from 13.6% to 14.6% of registrants
- Non-practising registration decreased from 4.9% to 2.8% of registrants
