Patient safety is, and always has been, of paramount importance to Allergan Aesthetics. We support evidence-based recommendations to protect the safety of Australians who choose to have cosmetic medical procedures; and believe consumers should be fully informed of both the risks and the benefits involved so that they can make informed decisions and provide formal written consent in advance.

Allergan Aesthetics ANZ is clear that injectable treatments (dermal fillers and toxin injections) are medical procedures and as such, they should only be performed by a trained and qualified healthcare professional, in an appropriate clinical environment.

We recommend that consumers considering any cosmetic medical procedure check the accreditation of their healthcare professional on an approved register and, where products are proposed to be used, check that these are locally approved by the Therapeutic Goods Administration, as part of their research before proceeding.
